

## Return to Field Patient Care/Extended Leave

#### I. Purpose:

To establish a standard for EMS providers with an active Washington State certification to return to providing field patient care in Kitsap County after a six (6) month or longer extended leave due to illness, injury, military service, or time in a non-patient care assignment/appointment.

#### II. Policy:

Field providers shall complete a process of training and evaluation in order to return to full-provider privileges in Kitsap County after an extended leave of absence.

#### **III.** Procedure:

After the EMS Office is notified of an impending return to duty after an extended leave, the following steps must be completed.

- A. BLS providers shall regain their protocol privileges once they complete the first three steps:
  - 1. The provider shall address any expired DOH credentials prior to any field-patient care.
  - 2. The provider shall take and pass the current Kitsap County Protocol exam with a minimum score of 80%.
  - 3. The provider shall become current with their CPR card/training.
  - 4. Once the provider has regained their privileges, they shall arrange a training plan with the KCEMS training coordinator, and their fire chief/or their



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designee. The plan will include the provider becoming current with the OTEP program's mandatory training requirements, as outlined in the *BLS Training* and *Recertification Policy*. This training shall be completed within 90 days and not exceed their expiration date.

- 5. The provider shall be assigned any field or competency evaluations per their district policy.
- B. ALS providers shall regain their protocol privileges once they complete the first three steps:
  - The provider shall address any expired DOH credentials before any fieldpatient care.
  - 2. The provider shall take and pass the current Kitsap County Protocol exam with a minimum score of 80%.
  - 3. The provider shall provide proof of current ACLS and PALS certifications.
  - 4. Once the provider has regained their privileges, they shall arrange a training plan with the KCEMS training coordinator, fire chief/or their designee. The plan will include the provider becoming current with the OTEP program's mandatory training requirements, as outlined in the *ALS Training and Recertification Policy*. This training shall be completed within 90 days and not exceed their expiration date.
  - 5. The provider shall be assigned any field or competency evaluations per their district policy.

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
