



## ***Kitsap County Student Course Syllabus NREMT Skills Refresher Course 2025***

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### **Welcome to the 2025 Kitsap County NREMT Refresher Course**

Welcome to the 2025 Kitsap County NREMT Refresher Course. This class is divided into two sessions. The first-morning session is for review of your skills. The afternoon session includes testing and sign-off on paperwork.

### **Prerequisites**

- National Registry EMT-B and Washington State Department of Health EMT-B certification.

### **Course Overview:**

Operating as an individual or as a member of a team in accordance with adopted procedures:

1. The candidate will demonstrate the proper medical and trauma patients assessment.
2. The candidate will demonstrate proper use of basic EMT immobilization equipment.
3. The candidate will demonstrate proper patient care procedures on simulated patients.

### **Process:**

The candidate shall be trained to perform the following skills as directed. Training shall include the prescribed skills for operating as a certified EMT. The candidate shall complete an online/in person didactic refresher prior to participating in this skills refresher course. The evaluation is complete when the candidate has been evaluated and the Washington State DOH EMT Psychomotor Skill Verification Form for NREMT has been signed by the ESE/SEI.

After a course review, the participant will perform the skills identified as necessary by the National Registry of EMT's for recertification/readmittance to the NREMT's. The participant will perform in accordance with the Washington State EMT Practical Sheets. A certified Washington State EMS Evaluator will evaluate the participant's performance.



**Successful Completion:**

In order for the student to successfully complete this course and qualify for signing off of the NREMT psychomotor form, the following objectives must be met:

1. Attend the required session and successfully complete all required skills stations.

**Attendance:**

Student must attend both sessions in order to successfully pass the course.

**Skill Stations:**

Each student must master the necessary set of skills required per NREMT skill standards. The course will use the NREMT skill sheets. Students will be evaluated on each of their required skills.

**Personal Conduct and Appearance:**

A professional appearance and attitude is expected of all students during class. Sexually provocative dress is discouraged. If any of the class instructors feel the student is acting in an unsafe, unprofessional, or immature manner or has inadequate personal hygiene, the student will be counseled. If appropriate action is not taken, the student will be administratively withdrawn from the course.

Pagers, radios, and cellular phones will be turned off or set to "silent alert" during class. Talking on cell phones or texting during class or during any clinical experience will be a reason for the student to be expelled from the class for the day. Any such expulsion will require the student to get permission to return to class by the lead instructor. Students may not record video or audio of any class without the instructor's explicit permission at the beginning of EACH INDIVIDUAL CLASS SESSION. Video or audio recording without the expressed permission of the instructor will result in the student being expelled from class.

THERE WILL BE NO TOBACCO USE ON THE GROUNDS OF ANY LECTURE OR LAB LOCATION.

**Touching:**

Due to the nature of this class, students will be required to touch fellow classmates during lab portions of the class. Any report of inappropriate touching or sexual comments will be investigated and may result in immediate dismissal of the offending student or faculty, and the matter referred to the appropriate authority.

**Harassment:**

Harassment is defined as: "to create an unpleasant or hostile situation by uninvited and unwelcome verbal or physical conduct." Any type of harassment should be reported to the instructor or the Kitsap County EMS office immediately. Harassment will not be tolerated. The person(s) found guilty of harassment will not be allowed to continue with the EMS evaluator class.



**Classroom Facilities and Equipment:**

It is the responsibility of every student/group to help maintain the areas where the class is being held. This includes all the "break-out" rooms used for lab days as well as the classroom itself and common areas. Students are expected to dispose of all rubbish, including gum, in the appropriate garbage cans.

Food and drink will be allowed in the class with the permission of the class instructor or lecturer. This privilege may be withdrawn by any instructor at any time.

The class is also responsible for the maintenance and care of the medical equipment used in the class. If the equipment is not in good working order, the equipment should be given to the instructor for repair or replacement. All equipment must be cleaned and returned to storage after each class.

**Academic Dishonesty:**

If an instructor suspects any academic dishonesty, the student may be asked to withdraw from the class involuntarily.

**Note on NREMT Certification:**

At the completion of this course, the student will be given a "NREMT psychomotor completion form."

This is not a guarantee of EMT CME renewal or NREMT renewal. This is only one piece of a larger puzzle. It is the provider's own responsibility to complete the renewal process.
